

Weaverham Forest Primary School and Nursery Remote Learning Action Plan

In September 2020, all our classes returned to full-time education following the Covid-19 closure in March. Although we hope that the majority of our children will now have an uninterrupted experience, there is the possibility that an individual child, a class bubble, or indeed the whole school, will need to self-isolate for a period of time. We have therefore put in place a plan for remote learning so that all children can continue with their education. This meets the expectations set out in the DfE guidance 'Remote Education Support'

If a child does not have access to a computer/laptop and/or the internet, the school will do all it can to support children and will provide paper packs of learning. Parents will be reminded to make the school aware of any barriers to accessing remote learning. Paper copies will still be available.

When we locked down in April, Remote Learning was something for the future. The staff have worked tirelessly in ensuring that if your child is self-isolating or if the bubble bursts and the children are learning from home, that their learning continues.

Scenario A -

When individual children are self-isolating the school will use the pupil login area of our website for remote learning.

On this page will be important information regarding remote learning during absence from school.

You will find here an overview of lessons to be completed each day. When you login, you will see specifically the curriculum expectations set by your class teacher.



It will provide learning across the curriculum and children will be expected to spend a similar amount of time completing this as they would spend learning in school.

Scenario B -

If a whole class is self-isolating, the school will use a combination of live teaching (providing the teacher is not unwell) using Microsoft Teams and the pupil login area of our website.

Scenario C -

If there is a whole school closure or national lockdown and schools are only open to vulnerable or key worker children, then school will continue to provide a mix of live teaching and curriculum content on our website.

The Oak National Academy.

This provides the equivalent of 3 hours of lessons per day for primary school children. In their 'classroom' each lesson is hour-long. They are delivered by a teacher, with a pre-recorded video as well as quizzes, worksheets and creative activities. It's all easy to use, there is no login or password, and you can access the lessons on any device- pupils only need materials they can find at home.

Providing feedback

Pupils can send any completed work to teachers via their school email account.

Alternatively, work that children complete on paper should be kept safe and returned to school when safe to do so.

Contact with pupils/ parents

Parents can contact the school via telephone or the school admin email address. Teachers will email back feedback if required. Any response should be made within 48 hours. Where a



pupil is self-isolating on medical ground for a significant period of time, contact will be made via telephone on a weekly basis to monitor learning and provide support if needed.

Pupils identified as vulnerable will be contacted on a weekly basis and support offered, as necessary.

Data protection

When accessing personal data, all staff members will: Only use their official school email account and connect to the school network using their school laptop only.

Sharing personal data

Staff members are unlikely to need to collect and/or share personal data. However, if it does become necessary, staff are reminded to collect and/or share as little personal data as possible online. All data collection will be compliant with GDPR guidelines.

Keeping devices secure

All staff will take appropriate steps to ensure their devices remain secure. Computers should be locked if left inactive for a period of time. Operating systems must be up to date – always install the latest updates.

Monitoring arrangements

This policy will be reviewed by the SLT as and when updates to home learning are provided by the government.
